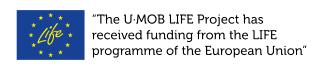

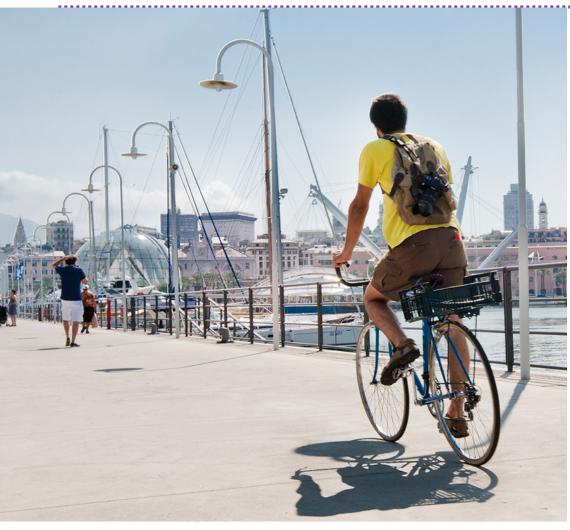












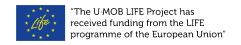
## Our mission

PRINCE (feb 2018-dec 2022) is an experimental project to encourage students sustainable mobility

The general objective of the project is the definition and implementation of new incentive/loyalty/ reward/discount policies linked to the use of sustainable means of transport for urban journeys to university.

The studied solutions should be scalable, in order to be easily adapted to other types of systematic trips with similar characteristics.



























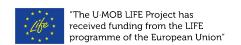

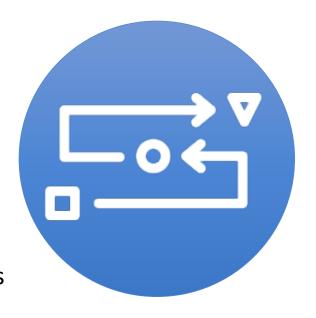


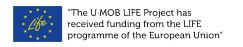


## The methodological approach

proposed in the research foresees five successive work phases:

- 1- collection and analysis: of different experiences used to promote sustainable mobility by other universities; of students' mobility habits; of the sustainable mobility means available on the territory under study;
- 2- definition of the strategy for the identification and provision of incentives through a co-design process with the main local stakeholders (involvement of third parties, choice of incentives, definition of rules for the assignment of points associated with sustainable travel);
- 3- development of the technological systems for monitoring student trips and assigning points;
- 4- testing phase to assess the effectiveness of the system implemented;
- 5- implementation of the approach: application of the model designed for an entire academic year.





















# Innovative features

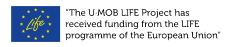
PRINCE foresees to use incentives and rewards to promote sustainable mobility focusing on students and their choices

Changing mobility habits is not a simple process and is usually forced through the introduction of restrictive policies such as traffic bans or charging for access or parking.

A new way of understanding urban mobility is to use incentive policies as a lever for sustainability.

It is likely that an appropriate mix of pricing policies, monetary incentives or inkind incentives will provide a sufficiently strong incentive for citizens to reduce their direct urban mileage by a significant percentage or to switch to other modes of transport.















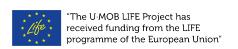
























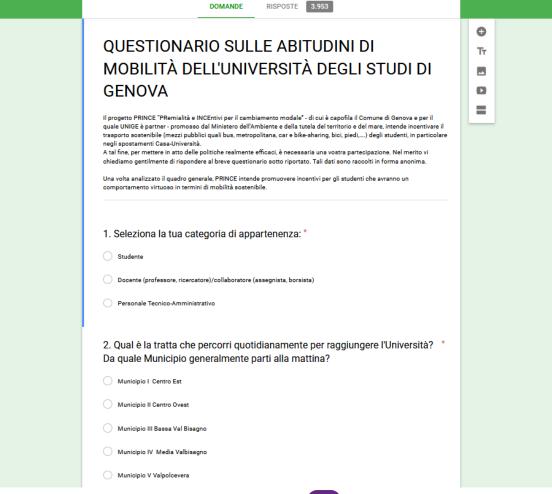


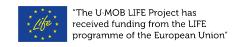

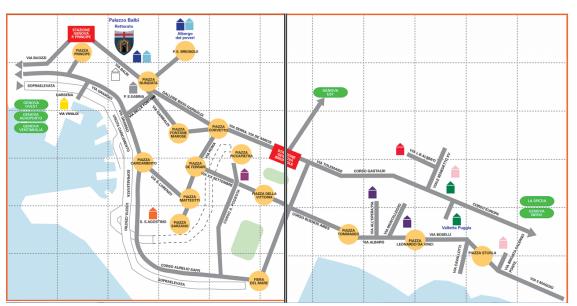




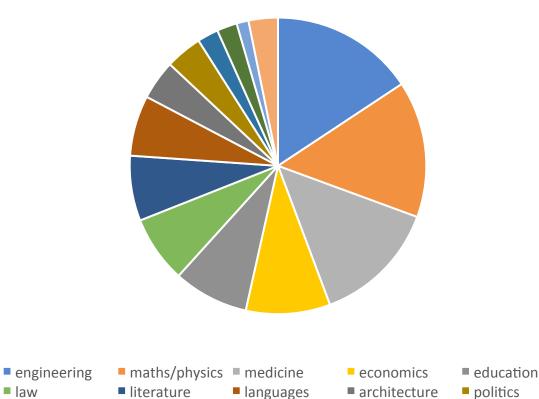


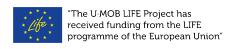
## Students travel behaviour 1/4

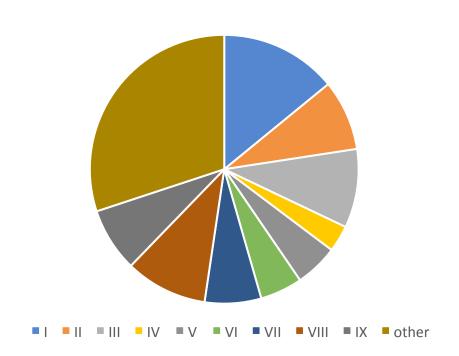




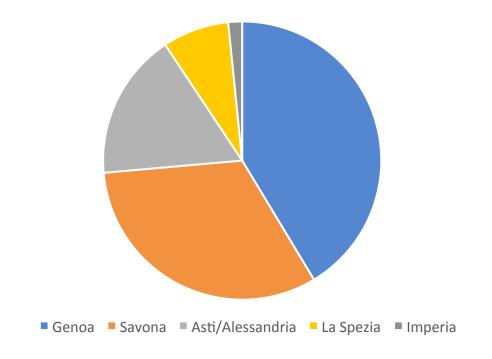


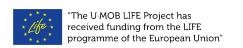
## Students travel behaviour 2/4

#### if you do not live in Genoa, what is your municipality?















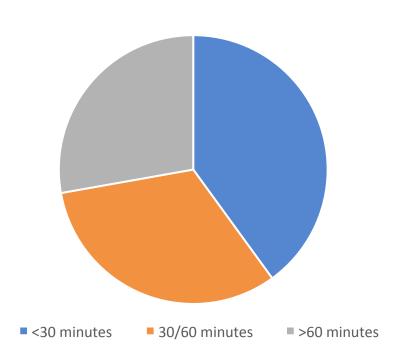




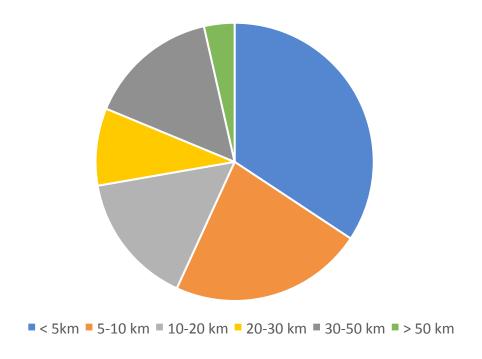


## Students travel behaviour 3/4

#### How many miles do you travel to reach your campus?















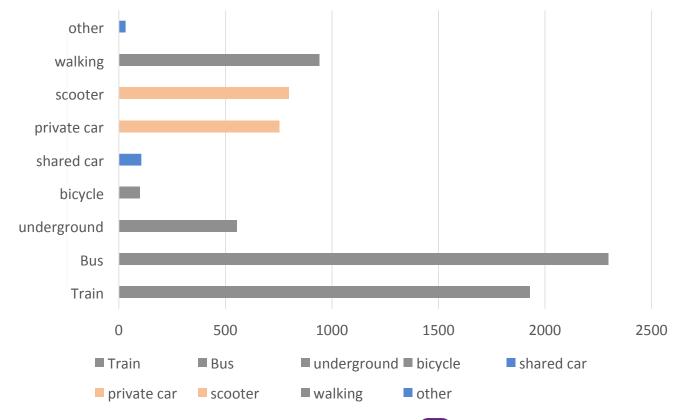

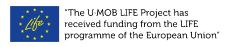








# Innovative ICT solutions



















## ICT solutions to support sustainable mobility

## objective

Designing, implementing, testing, evaluating, disseminating and exploiting new ICT tools for "smart" mobility, created specifically for the needs of students in order to promote changes in their everyday travel habits to reach university



local buses, shared bikes and cars will be equipped with beacons: small devices that enable an accurate location of data. All the university students are invited to download an app, designed by PRINCE partners, which transfers their travel information to the beacons connected to a web platform. Thanks to this technology, it will be possible to map student's travel from home to school and vice versa.

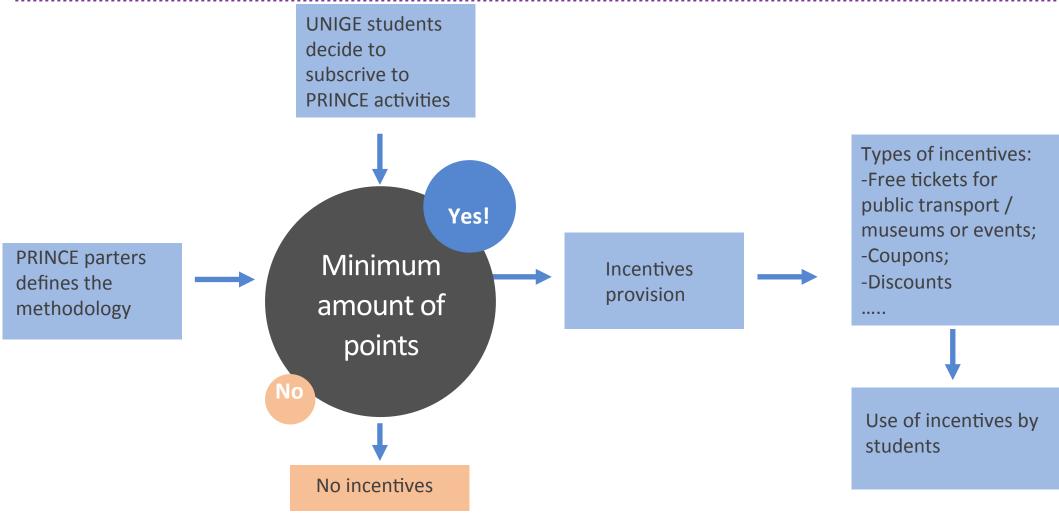


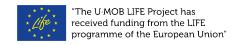


























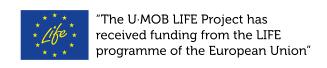


## CONCLUSION
